New 'Research Impact Handbook' from ANU Engagement and Impact

Achieving and showcasing impact and engagement can be tricky for early-career researchers. But getting started early and planning for impact at the project development stage is critical to ensuring you can show the benefit of your research over time. The Engagement and Impact Unit have developed a suite of resources including the Research Impact Handbook to help you plan and embed impact into your research projects from the outset.

ANU Library subscribes to Lawyerly, signs 'read and publish' agreement with Company of Biologists

ANU researchers and students studying law now have access to a fantastic new resource. The ANU Library is now <u>subscribed to Lawyerly</u>. Lawyerly provides a unique service as an independent news source devoted exclusively to legal news. It is the only publisher in this area with daily updates.

ANU Library has also signed a <u>new Read and Publish Agreement</u> with Company of Biologists for the period 2023-2025. The agreement allows ANU authors to publish open access in COB journals without paying Article Processing Charges (APC).

CartoGIS Services offers map-making, spatial analysis and 'storytelling with maps' training

CartoGIS Services is a team of cartographic and geographic information system specialists working at ANU. They offer a range of training sessions on the creation, analysis, management and promotion of maps and spatial data.

Starting in August, they're running a free suite of training to aid any ANU Staff or Student who's interested in bringing GIS into their work:

- Intro to ArcGIS Pro (Self-paced online course)
- · Intro to Story Maps (August 10, 17, 24 and 31)
- Intro to GIS Analysis for Research (September 28 & October 5, 12 and 19)


Webinar: Consumer engagement on grant writing » Wednesday 6 September – 10am-1pm
